2006 PETIT VERDOT

Swan Valley WA

The wine is deep purple red, with aromas of violets, dark chocolate, and rich cedary oak. The palate is full and deep. The flavours are rich and powerful, with excellent depth of sweet black fruit and seasoned oak. It has great length of flavour, with cedary dry tannins and a generous finish.

A more reserved wine than 2004 or 2005, this wine really reflects the cooler season. We used 100 percent new French Burgundy oak to complement the fruit, resulting a full bodied complex style.

Made from our fruit picked on the 23rd of March - very late. The cool spring and summer, and slightly heavier than usual crop the cause. Never the less the tiny berries were black and bursting with flavour.
