Faber Vineyard Frankland River Cabernet Sauvignon 2012 Posted on 22 September 2014

Aged for 18 months in French oak. Bottled direct from barrel. Tweaked label design too (old label pictured here).

Luscious style of cabernet. Intense, soft, generous. The kind you can 'serve to anyone'. Awash with blackcurrant, sultana, boysenberry, black earth and smoky cedary oak. It packs a punch but feels fresh throughout. Sails on through the finish. Tannin has melted almost entirely into the fruit. Deceptively complex. Can be consumed young or with age.

From the Millard Vineyard in the Swan Valley. One barrel only.

Intense shiraz. Super concentration of fruit and oak. Cedarwood, smoky vanillin, black- and blue-berried fruit, cloves. Silken as it oozes through the mouth. Threaded with firm-ish tannin. Oak is slightly overplayed, you could argue, but the fruit is of ripping quality.

Less of a success than last years model.

For the synaesthetes among us, this is a very purple smelling wine. Blue and red fruit – floral and peppery – banana split vanilla of older oak, some dried herb. Medium bodied, quite fresh and tangy – acidity pretty sharp and bitey here – silty open weave tannin, decent finish. Needs a bit of time, maybe.

Faber Vineyard Grenache 2013

A new wine and new labels from Swan Valley stalwart, John Griffiths. Dry grown Grenache from Andrew Pruno's vineyard, grown in laterite ironstone gravel along the base of the Darling Scarp.

Light in colour and pretty to smell. Shows a little sweet spiced banana oak, dusty musk Grenache perfume, red fruits, cherry cola and subtle dried herb. Light to medium bodied, savoury rather than fruit sweet but does have juicy red berry flavour, light playful kitten's tongue tannin and even acidity that's fresh, but unobtrusive. Clean length. Minor amount of warmth, but nothing overbearing. Lovely wine. Lively. Great to drink. Well done.

Faber Vineyard Reserve Shiraz 2011

Big warm hearted wine from big warm hearted John Griffiths.

Black fruit, but with a kind of boysenberry and raspberry liqueur lilt, tar and earth, aniseed, a little spice, banana and coffee oak – deep smelling wine. Full bodied, black fruit with pippy sort of raspberried flavour and acidity, the typical ferrous quality that grapes grown his part of the world seem to have, and a rugged, yet pliant, set of open weave tannin. Rasberry liqueur and coffee rolls on the long fresh finish. Needs a bit of time to settle, but has all the makings of a good Reserve

From the Faber vineyard and Millard's vineyard, further up Haddrill Road.

Quite perfumed but black fruited with a little spice and vanilla marzipan oak. Full bodied, slight over-ripe dried blueberry and plum flavour but also with that ferrous and earthy quality that seems to be typical of these vineyards. Carries a little warmth and open weave lightly chalky tannin, but the grunt is good in context. Finish is perfumed and sweetly fruited and earthy all at once. Bold style, but one with style.
